November will also have special days as you can see in the dates to remember section on the left side of the page. Parents are welcome to attend the Remembrance Day Ceremony on Friday November 10th and it will start at 11:15 a.m.

Progress reports will arrive home on November 9th and provide parents with feedback on how their child is starting off the year. Parents will have an opportunity to speak with their child's teacher on interview day and I hope you will take advantage of this opportunity. At Bridlewood, we work as a home and school team to support our students.

The book fair runs November 21 - 24th and will be open during the hours of the parent teacher interviews as well so parents have a chance to visit.

Our school learning plan will be developed to be specific to the areas of need we identify.
